The Hampshire Endodontic Study Club is once again lucky enough to have two highly qualified experts coming to speak to us – this time on the Perio-endo interface. The periodontium and dental pulp are so closely associated - by proximity and by presence of apical and lateral canal communications - that one is tempted to put aside the notion of two distinct anatomical structures. Interconnections at the interface allow for passage of pathogens between the two areas which can give rise to confusion in determining true disease aetiology. Following this lecture attendees will better be able to diagnose disease and better understand differences in treatment approaches.

Riccardo and Elisa are both Eastman trained Specialist Periodontists and they are also husband and wife! Riccardo qualified in Milan whilst Elisa attended Madrid. - To understand the effect of periodontal disease and therapy on the pulp.

Principle 7 – Maintain, develop and work within your professional knowledge and skills

States that Patients expect that all members of the dental team keep their skills up to date.

7.1 You must provide good quality care based on current evidence and authoritative guidance. You must find out about current evidence and best practice which affect your work, premises, equipment and business and follow them. You must work within your knowledge, skills, professional competence and abilities

7.2 You should only deliver treatment and care if you are confident that you have had the necessary training and are competent to do so. If you are not confident to provide treatment, you must refer the patient to an appropriately trained colleague.

7.3 You must update and develop your professional knowledge and skills throughout your working life. You should take part in activities that maintain update or develop your knowledge and skills. Your continuing professional development (CPD) activity should improve your practice.
